

Zabriskies *at* New Bridge

Albrecht's name appears on local deeds as an interpreter including for adjacent property to New Bridge at Tantaqua's Creek/Coles Brook.

Albrecht Zabrowskij
b. Approx 1638, Danzig, East Prussia
Christened 1639, Engstburgh, Netherlands
d. 9/1/1711
Emigrated to New Amsterdam on the ship "The Fox" in 1662.

Machtelt Van Der Linde
b. Approx 1656, Engstburgh, Netherlands
Baptized 1/19/1661 in the NY Dutch Reformed Church
m. 1/8/1677
d. after 1734

Machtelt was the daughter of Joost Van Der Linde & Sophia Roelofs Van Gelder. Dutch, she joined Lutheran Church.

Jacob is said to be buried in Zabriskie Plot, Paramus

1 Jacob Zabriskie
b. 4/12/1679
d. between 1756 & 1758
In 1699, married **Antje Terhune**
Children: Hendricktje, Fytje, Marritje, Albert J., Jan, Jannetje, Rachel, Machtelt, Stephen, Jacob J.

Jan Zabrowskij or Zabriskie
1 b. 1681-82
d. between 1765 & 1/21/1766
In 1706 married
(1) Elizabeth Claes Romeyn
Children: Albert J., Matilda, Nicholas, Christina
In 12/6/1712 Married
(2) **Margrietje Durie**
9 Children including Elizabeth, Jan J., Jacob, Peter, Joost, Rachel, Cornelius & Christian

First names repeat in later generations

Margrietje is daughter of Jan Durie & Rachel Cresson.

Jannetje, daughter of Hildebrand Lozier & Christina DeBaun
Jannetje remarried Loyalist Peter Valleau and moved to Nova Scotia with son Andrew and started a new family.

2 Albert J. Zabriskie
b. 1/17/1708 d. 1/17/1753
In 1739 married **Marytje Hopper**
Children: Antje & Andries

2 Jan J. Zabriskie
b. 8/5/1716
d. 9/17/1774
In 1739 married **Annatje Ackerman**
Children: John & Elizabeth, twins
Elizabeth m. Edmund Seaman

Daughter of Egbert Ackerman & Elizabeth Bryant, Annatje was b. 1720. Jan & Annatje purchased 40 acres and mill site from widow of Johannes Ackerman 1745. The Zabriskies built the first section of the Steuben House in 1752, their initials are on the datestone in the south wall. The datestone depicts the tide mill water wheel.



Andrew, purchased the Steuben House & 40 acres in 1815 & expanded the business
He married Jane Elizabeth, daughter of David Anderson & Antje Demarest
Could take their sloop all the way and back to NYC for trade.
Notice Albert started using **Zobriskie**.

3 Andries A. Zabriskie
chr. 7/6/1746 d. 3/10/1771
In 1769 married **Jannetje Lozier**
Andries died before son was born.
A farmer lived in Paramus, buied in Zabriskie Cemetery.

3 John Zabriskie, Jr
chr. 9/3/1741
Estate settled 4/20/1794
In 1764 married **Jannetje Goelett**
Children: Jan, Jr. & Annetjen

The Zabriskies enlarged the Steuben House in 1767 - 12-rooms, 7 fireplaces. Timeline & architecture suggests the whole north block added for two generations & the birth of John Jr. in 1767. They prospered with 2 mills, shipping wharf/sloop & store. John served as Lt. Col. Bergen Militia initially but resigned & the family fled to British held Manhattan after the war started. The house & property served as a battleground, fort, encampment ground, military headquarters & intelligence-gathering post in every year of the American Revolution. The 40 acre property was confiscated from the Loyalist family by NJ & given to Major General Baron de Steuben in 12/1783.

David's sister, Elizabeth, b. 7/25/1805, may have created the 1819 sampler.

4 Andrew A. Zobriskie
b. 6/15/1771 d. 5/7/1837
Moved to Montgomery Co, NY
Served in NY Militia 1806-15
Owned, lived in Steuben House
In 1793 married **Jane Elizabeth Anderson**
b. 7/7/1774 - d. 12/25/1852

4 John Zabriskie, Jr
b. 9/30/1767
d. 7/6/1793
In 1792, married **Catherine Hoagland**
Newlywed, he died suddenly, buried in the French Burying Ground in New Milford. 'Caty' is buried there too, d. 9/1849
No children with John.
Widow Catherine remarried to Abraham Collins.
The Zabriskie-Steuben Estate eventually sold to John Anderson who sold it to Andrew A. Zobriskie in 1815.
We currently do not yet know if there's any connection to Andrew's wife Elizabeth Anderson.

Steuben sold his estate back to Jan Zabriskie, Jr, Dec 4, 1788. Published in *New Jersey Journal* "Long-noted as the best stand for trade in the state of New Jersey. Large well-built stone house, thoroughly rebuilt lately, a gristmill with two run of stone; excellent new kiln for drying grain for export built lately; other outbuildings, and 40 acres of land, one-half of which is excellent meadow. Situated on the bank of the river by which produce can be conveyed to New York in a few hours, and sloops of 40 tons burden may load and discharge alongside of the mill."

"Capt D. Anderson Zobriskie" commanded schooners & later the tugboat "Wesley Stoney on the Hackensack River.
The newspaper noted he added the veranda in 1872.

Owned, lived in Steuben House
d. 11/19/1887
m. **Jane Anderson**, 1835

D. Anderson Zobriskie
6 b. 4/4/1837
d. 5/27/1907
In 1859 married **Hannah Durie**
Mill burned down about 1852

7 Magdalena Zobriskie
baptized 8/30/1868
d. 7/27/1919
Magdalena continued to live at the Steuben House, did not marry.
Property sold to William Randolph Hearst
